

Ordinance 06-04

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND PART
135.001 OF THE ZONING
ORDINANCE 52-3 OF THE CITY OF
OAK HILL

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission for the City of Oak Hill, Tennessee was created by Ordinance 52-3 in part 135.001 of the Compilation of Ordinances in 1952; and

WHEREAS, said ordinance created a ten (10) member planning commission including, Mr. Paul C. Simpson; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Simpson is deceased and the City Manager has proposed certain modifications to the ordinance to attempt to achieve maximum participation by Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS, The City Manager's recommendations appear to be necessary; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners desire to make the amendments in accordance with said recommendations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City of Oak Hill through the Board of Commissioners that Ordinance 52-3 is hereby amended as follows:


1. Part 135.001 is amended to delete all references to Paul C. Simpson
2. Part 135.001, Section 1 is amended to delete the second sentence in its entirety and replace it with the following three sentences.

“The Planning Commission shall consist of ten (10) members, three of which shall be the Mayor, Vice-Mayor and the remaining Commissioner, who shall serve as ex-officio members. The other seven (7) members shall be appointed by the Mayor, for terms of three (3) years. A Quorum shall consist of four members, any combination of appointed members and the three ex-officio members.”


3. Part of 135.001, Section 1, is amended to deleted all of the remaining portions of this paragraph.
4. Part 135.001, Section 3 is deleted in its entirety. The follow provision is added at the end of Section 1 as follows:

“Any vacancy in any appointed position shall be filled for the unexpired term by the Mayor.”

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage of second reading.
